Introduction

The Doctor of Philosophy Program in Governance and Development is a unique interdisciplinary program offered by the Graduate School of Public Administration at NIDA. The Program emphasizes the commonality of administration, competencies and knowledge that run through all organizations, both large and small. The program is designed to improve the skills of academics, researchers, executives and professionals from public and private agencies and institutions, including educational institutions, government agencies, business and non-government organizations in order for them to be able to better serve their organizations.

The selection and training of future scholars and administrators is a most serious responsibility in our society. How well these tasks are accomplished will be of great importance to the general public and to all levels of government. As we move toward convergence of organizational goals within a changing global environment, contemporary administrators will be required to exercise their decision-making power in an increasingly complex and uncertain world. This program is expected to provide graduates with the requisite conceptual, analytical, and effective skills that are relevant to their goals and also of significant value to society and to their workplace institution, business, or agency.

Rationale and Program Objectives

The Ministry of University Affairs' decision to grant the National Institute of Development Administration (NIDA) its own Ph.D. program in 1984 was in recognition of the modern reality that the Ph.D. is the pre-eminent degree of higher learning and the historical unavailability of Ph.D. degrees in Thailand and other developing countries notwithstanding. The Doctor of Philosophy Program in Governance and Development (International Program) is designed to prepare students for an academic career with the following objectives:

- 1) To provide the students with a strong theoretical foundation in philosophy, theories, and concepts related to development and governance so that they would be able to develop clear and meaningful insights for professional growth.
- 2) To train the students in multiple disciplinary perspectives so that they would be able to critically analyze, compare, and synthesize theories, perspectives, concepts, and complex issues in development and governance.
- 3) To improve the students' ability to integrate knowledge and research methodologies in the field of development and governance, more specifically in the fields of organization, human resource, management, policy, development, public finance, and financial management.
- 4) To provide the students with rigorous skills to do research on real world challenges concerning development and governance.

- 5) To develop the students' communication skills that they can use in the presentation of their researches on development and governance in academic conferences and seminars and in the research publishing processes at both national and international levels.
- 6) To foster and nurture a new generation of leaders for change who possess knowledge, integrity, and responsibility for self, profession, and society, qualities that they can use to formulate innovative ideas relating to development and governance for the improvement of the lives of people.

Required Documents

Applicants for the Doctoral Program must submit the following application documents:

1. A completed application form (the application form can be download from our websites <http://gspa.nida.ac.th> or www.nida.ac.th)
2. Statement of purpose
3. Two letters of recommendation
4. Curriculum Vitae (CV)
5. Two (1 inch) photos
6. Application fee 1,300 Thai Baht
7. For foreign applicants: One copy of passport
For Thai applicants: One copy of ID card and one copy of household registration
8. Copy of bachelor's and master's degree certificates (one for each)
9. Copy of bachelor's and master's degree transcripts (one for each)
10. Copy of proof for a minimum TOEFL or IELTS as specified by NIDA's English language proficiency requirements.

Application Procedures

1. Applicants can print an application form out via the school's website <http://gspa.nida.ac.th> or www.nida.ac.th
2. Online application is only available at <http://entrance.nida.ac.th>. The application fee of 1,300 Baht; should be made within June 24, 2022 at Bangkok Bank or Counter Service. Applicants using bank transfer are required to attach evidence of payment (copy of transfer order) to their application documents. The application documents must be submitted along with the application fee receipt.

Program Objectives

The Ph.D. Program in Governance and Development (International) is designed to provide quality, relevant, and transformative education in governance, development and research aimed to develop highly competent, innovative and socially accountable professionals to become the new generation of leaders who are responsive to the needs of the local and international community. The program is conducted entirely in English and is available to international and Thai students.

Degree Requirements

A three to four-year study program, including 27 credit hours of graduate course study, passing a written Qualifying Examination for candidacy, 36 credit hours of dissertation, and an oral defense of the doctoral dissertation.

Selection Procedure

1. Consideration of application form and letters of recommendation.
2. Consideration of English proficiency test scores (TOEFL or IELTS).
3. Interview and/or assessment by the Ph.D. Program Executive Committee.

Class Schedule

Classes are conducted on weekday evenings from 18.00 – 21.00 hrs.

Fee

7,000 Baht per credit hour. Total fees for the entire program are approximately 500,000 Baht.
